## VIII. Building Concerns (See next page)

### February, 2014 Building Concerns

#### High School:

- tartan time issues continue (students “skipping” or being tardy to school, getting students to participate in activities, etc.)
- CCR meetings - some parents can not make the designated times because of snow days.

#### Elementary Schools:

- Concern about notifying parents when bed bugs are found in the classroom population. *Letter was sent to parents informing them how to deal with bed bugs in the home.* Staff would like a district policy about notifying individual classes if a bed bug is found so parents can be on ALERT.

**General:**

- Contingency days were not marked on the district calendar for the 2013-14 school year. *Corrected on February 17. Trying to find where a contingency plan may be located since previous board agendas and minutes are not accessible on website.*
- Ongoing problems with technology - inconvenience/interruption of lessons.
- OHEA is extremely concerned that the administrative team is over-emphasizing grade distribution.
- Are some students getting too much remediation? Some students in elementary missing recess. Some students in middle school being “pulled” from encore class for second block of remediation.
